We woke up to the day of the major event, CERN. The tram took us there and we started with the museum.



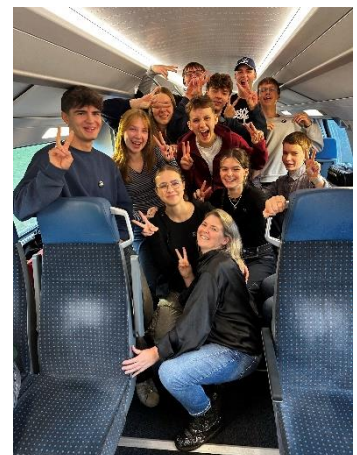
A museum where we could test and try a lot of different activities, all on the theme physics.
